### **Food Safety Training Program**

In Carbon County 15 adults who cook for schools, nursing homes and senior centers have been trained in Food Safety. In addition to that over 35 students of High School age have also participated in the program Food Safety Works. Food safety education is recognized as a contributing factor in the decline of food borne illness.

### **Youth Education Collaboration**

Stillwater, Yellowstone and Carbon County participate in three successful cross county programming educational events. The clothing festival reaches between 60 and 90 youth, foods festival reaches about 30 youth and the money management program reached about 45 youth. These day long workshops are designed to teach specific skills with a community service component.

### **Estate Planning program**

Fifty-seven people were educated on issues of estate planning. These programs included Montana Medical Savings Accounts, Distribution of untitled property, and Rights of the terminally ill. These programs help to expose the issues so that people can make more informed decisions.

### **School Enrichment and After School programs for Youth**

Ten different after school and in school enrichment programs have been conducted for students in Carbon County. Programs subjects have been embryology, nutrition and food safety, culture, and wildlife education.
